




- Admissions booklets completed by you


Use the following baxes to reflect on friendship.

Words and ideas that will help you with the above

- 1. Calm, caring, kind, good listener, funny, confident, cheerful, understanding, responsible, thoughtful
- 2. Someone who enjoys the same things, shares similar interests
- 3. Arrogant, rude, selfish, thoughtless, unkind, someone who ignores you or ignores you sometimes, jealousy

To make new friends you will need to have some 'conversation starters' ready to help you to begin talking to different people. Discuss some ideas about how you could start conversations with a peer and then add these to the speech subbles below.



You will already know that sometimes friendships can be a bit tricky. Use the following 'cards' as discussion points with your peers. What would you do in these situations?

- Your primary school friends are leaving you out.
- None of your primary school friends are on your bus. There are other year 7 children on your bus but you don't know them yet.
- You notice another year 7 who is always alone.
- There is another year 7 in your class who you have a feeling you would get on with really well. You don't know them yet.

- You have been invited to a birthday party of one of your new friends. You are not sure if you will know many people there.
- 7. You notice that some year 7s are leaving another person out- on purpose.
- You are finding it difficult to see your friends at lunchtime.


TOP 10 TIPS FOR HEALTHY FRIENDSHIPS
