What do exams look like this year?

Exams are *nearly* back to normal.

- In 2020 and 2021, exams didn't happen.
- In 2022, exams/NEA took place with modifications.
- In 2023, formula sheets for Maths, Physics and combined science.

And what about results?

- Grades were inflated when assigned by teachers and schools in 2020 and 2021.
- In 2022, grades were set at the midpoint of 2019 and 2021.
- In 2023, grades are expected to return to prepandemic levels.

There are a number of ways that you can make sure that you are fully prepared to perform at your best.

- 1. Watch the video below, recorded by Mr Fehr, including key information and revision advice.
- 2. Create and follow a revision timetable that is manageable, efficient and balanced.
- 3. Concentrate fully in lessons and complete all classwork and home learning tasks set.
- 4. Use your teachers as a resource and make use of subject top tip videos.
- 5. Organise yourself and schedule time to concentrate on revision without distraction.
- 6. Engage in tutor time activities to develop effective revision strategies.
- 7. Make use of independent study sites that have been signposted.
- 8. Attend targeted revision/intervention sessions that you are invited to.
- 9. Make time to relax, eat well and exercise to take care of your wellbeing.
- 10. Ask for support if you need it.

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What's happening with mock exams?

Why do we do them in the first place?

- 1. A diagnostic tool. What are your current strengths? What do you need to work on?
- 2. A contributor to estimated grades sent with college applications.
- 3. To practice the **routines** around formal exams.

An overview:

- 10 days of assessments
- Usually one or two assessments per day
- An assessment in each subject
- Full exam conditions
- In the hall for most students, including those with extra time
- Students with exams access arrangements in room 19/20
