Ensure all year 10 coursework is fully complete to the best of your ability and meeting the criteria. If this was not completed by September, it is now an urgent priority. Support sessions should be attended if you have been highlighted for 'targetted' support to either catch up or improve the quality of work. You should also continue to develop more refined observational drawing skills independently at home to access higher grades.

Geography	4. Online tasks to be completed	To read model answers to 6 and 8 mark answers from prior learning in Geography. To attempt similar questions and peer/self mark.	OCR Geography B GCSE 9-1 Hodder Revision Guide and Exam practice books. Revise all the key case studies in Geography. Produce story maps, revision flash cards, mind maps and or condensing text to 10 words as strategies to help revise case studies. To look at past papers from 2018 to get an idea of how each of the 3 papers are structured. To use Geography KS4 Team to access all Geography KS4 resources.

History	4. Online tasks to be completed	Knowledge/recall - embed and review tasks via the 'Targeted Team' using Microsoft Teams.	Use your Teams files to access revision material and all lessons relating to Medicine Through Time, Anglo-Saxon and Norman England and Russia 1917-41. Use GSCE Pod to revisit your understanding of these topics. Complete practice questions using a revision book you have purchased.
PE	1. After school support sessions	Addressing misconceptions identified from Year 10 exam. Knowledge organisers/low stakes quizzes/revision resource creation. Weekly after school sessions. Targeted are required but all are welcome if they require help on certain topics.	Use the OCR GCSE Physical Education guide alongside revision notes made to consolidate knowledge. Practice exam technique using past papers, focusing on longer answer questions. Use both BBC bitesize (OCR specification) and RevisionPod.
PE	2. Lunch time support sessions	GCSE PE Practical intervention - Friday lunchtimes supporting those with lower practical grades.	Record any NEA video evidence that needs to be done, in particular summer activities i.e. cricket. Consult the most up to date specification for skills that must be shown alongside competitive fixtures.
