Vaping Vigilance

Please continue to be vigilant for vaping paraphernalia. As we have previously communicated, vapes are being marketed in very clever and divisive ways such as stationery items and air pods. We believe that there are some adults locally who are supplying young people with vapes.





County Lines

Please be aware of the dangers of young people being coerced into county lines both off and online. County lines gangs are highly organised criminal networks that use sophisticated, and frequently evolving techniques to groom young people and evade capture by the police.

Dedicated mobile phone lines or 'deal lines' are used to help facilitate county lines drugs deals. Phones used are usually cheap, disposable and old fashioned, because they are changed frequently to avoid detection by the police. Phrases that young people may use to describe county lines include: 'running a line'; 'going OT/out there'; 'going country' and 'going cunch'.

Feeling Concerned About Someone's Safety?

The College Safeguarding Team will not be available during the summer break, therefore to report a crime:

- in an emergency, contact the police, call 999;
- if the person is not in immediate danger, contact the police, call 101.
