If you know what career or subject you want to study at University, but don't know what you need to get there Post 16...

Step 1 In your browser type; the best university for 2023

Step 2 Go to the university page and look up the course

Look at its entry requirements to determine what course and grade is needed for the degree in question.

Using 'mychoice16' search which colleges and sixth forms offer those courses. Attend open evenings to get a feel for the place and courses.

- Check which providers offer the subject you want to study
- Compare and organise by provider highlight favourites.

- Log in and search for opportunities section, and click 'Start' on the College / Sixth Form tool.
- Check which providers offer the subject you want to study
- Check what level(s) the subject you want to study is taught at
- Compare different institutions





If you are interested in an apprenticeship programme Post 16...

Step 1

Local colleges and training providers may offer apprenticeships or have information about available opportunities. Check 'mychoice16' for opportunities. Attend apprenticeship fairs and career events in your area.

Step 2

Depending on your GCSE results, this may determine whether a Level 2 (intermediate) or a Level 3 (advanced) apprenticeships is suitable. If you don't have English and maths GCSEs, you usually need to take qualifications in these subjects as part of the apprenticeship (but additional learning and support will be provided).

- You can select up to ten
 Standards. Search for the ones
 you're interested in using the
 keyword box, or rank them by
 things like number of vacancies
 and average salary to see which
 ones come at the top. You can
 also search for all Standards to
 see all the vacancies in your
 local area
