2. Complete homework on satchel:one and Teams

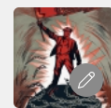
Complete these tasks every week. Some tasks will be revision but most will be based on completing the final unit.

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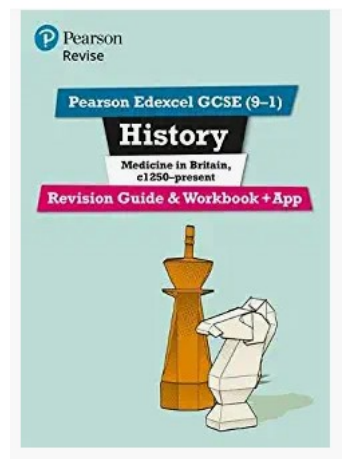
