Formula sheets for physics and Maths – already on Satchel One

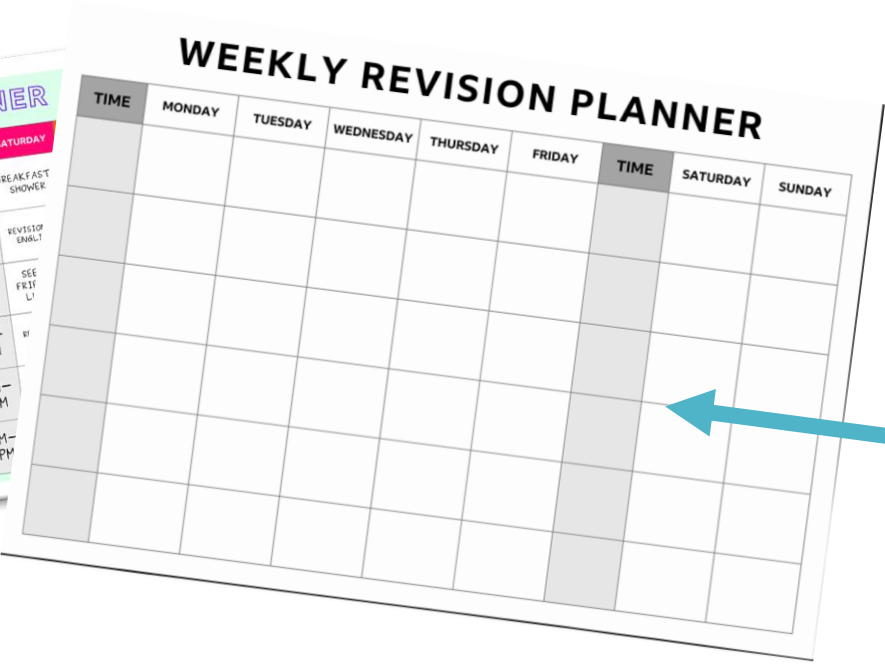
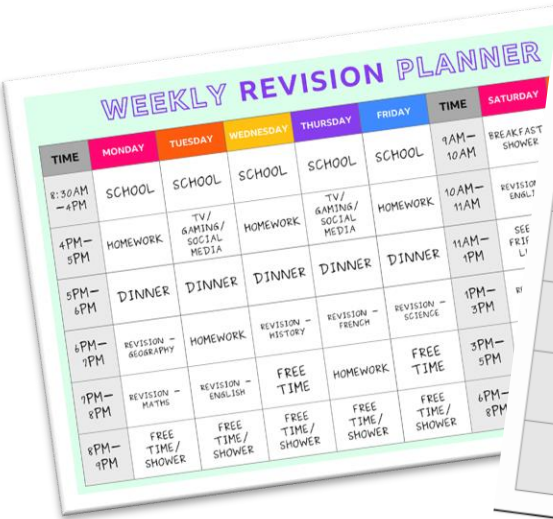

Subject	Mandatory Activity	Details of mandatory tasks for targeted students	Revision Advice for all students (independent + targeted)
Maths	4. Online tasks to be completed	Some students will be set weekly online tasks to be completed independently focused on specific skills. These will be set on Fridays, due the following Friday.	Students are encouraged to use HegartyMaths to focus on specific skills for improvement based on the recent mock exams.
	2. Lunch time support sessions	Some students will be asked to attend weekly 30-minute lunchtime support sessions on Wednesdays focused on specific skills.	
	1. After school support sessions	Some students will be asked to attend weekly 60-minute after school support sessions on Wednesdays focused on specific skills.	Students are welcome to join the after school sessions on Wednesdays. They can work on their Sparx homework, HegartyMaths, past papers or any other resource. We will have staff there to support them.
Additional Maths FSMQ	1. After school support sessions	Topic specific lessons on Wednesdays with Mrs Olding in M3. This session is intended for those who started the course late but all are welcome to attend.	Drop in session on Tuesdays with Mrs Olding in M3. This session focuses on Additional Mathematics FSMQ.
Statistics	1. After school support sessions	No students are targeted for Statistics. There is sufficient opportunity in class time for exam preparation.	Students who would like additional practice or support are invited to join the after school Maths support session on Wednesdays in the Business Suite.
English Language	4. Online tasks to be completed	Some students will be set weekly online tasks to be completed independently focused on specific skills.	Specific tasks will be suggested for students to engage with. This is with guidance from the teacher and builds on the reflective processes in the classroom after the mock feedback was given. Focus your homelearning and revision on these specific, granular, targeted tasks that are being suggested to you. Then use the Thursday lunchtime to further enhance your homelearning and address any concerns or misconceptions.
	2. Lunch time support sessions	Some students will be asked to attend weekly 30-minute lunchtime support sessions focused on specific exam elements or improve independent study skills.	All students are welcome to attend.
	1. After school support sessions	Some students will be asked to attend weekly 60-minute after school support sessions focused on specific skills.	All students are welcome to attend.
English Literature	4. Online tasks to be completed	Students will be guided towards specific platforms or videos to supplement the classroom learning. Completion of these will help close the gaps in their performance in the mock exams.	Students should fully read and understand the set texts as set to their your class. Learn the key quotations by heart, the subject terminology and context (when appropriate) that sits behind these key quotations. Then use the wider support on offer with sessions on Tuesdays after school and Thursdays at lunch to further enhance your homelearning and address any concerns or misconceptions.
Biology	1. After school support sessions	After school sessions to allow students to ask and check understanding of key concepts. Additional targeted lunchtime sessions are also available.	Use the revision books provided, kerboodle for access to the text book and some of the work sheets used in class.
