National Careers Week is a oneweek celebration of careers guidance and free resources in education across the UK.


Tens of thousands of students across the country took part in Careers Week last year, having an opportunity to access the Virtual Careers Fair and take part in other careers activities.




If you're in CAMP A;


- 1. Go to the <u>Careers library</u> and select a career profile.


