This document is primarily intended to summarise and communicate the assessment structure for each examination subject. Alongside, you will find information about homework and revision resources that should prove useful in supporting year 11 students.

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Non-examination Assessments (NEA)

What are NEAs?

NEAs measure subject-specific knowledge and skills that cannot be tested by timed written papers. NEAs are completed in class time and are not done in controlled conditions. That said, there are still strict guidelines around their completion, deadlines and marking.

Students are provided with the marking criteria in advance so that they can see what is necessary to meet the grade they desire. Students do not need to be directly supervised, they can continue their work at home (Music is an exception), and they are allowed unlimited access to electronic and printed resources. That said, teachers must be confident that the work student produce is their own.

Which subjects require NEAs?

NEAs are an essential part of assessment in many subjects, including: Art, Dance, Drama, Music, DT, Engineering, GCSE PE, Sport Science, Health & Social Care, and Food Preparation & Nutrition.

When do students find out what marks they have been awarded?

Marks will be made available on Go4Schools according to the timeline below. If a student has reason to believe their mark is incorrect, they may request a copy of their work before deciding if they would like a review of the marking. A reviewer will then check that the marking is consistent with the way the other work has been marked. Following a review, a mark can go up or down. All marks are also subject to change when the exam board moderates the marking.

Note: This guidance refers deliberately to marks, which are numerical scores. Grades (1-9 or Pass/Merit/Distinction) are not assigned to NEA work by LVC staff.

Home learning is managed in two ways; set work and self-directed.

Set work will be given by teachers regularly, approximately once a week. The format will vary (eg. research, development, experimentation, annotation, photography, focused drawing etc.).

Self-directed work is completed independently by automatically completing unfinished work or catching up on missed lessons/missing portfolio work when needed.

Home learning tasks are of paramount importance and contribute a huge amount to the content of the portfolio, as well as the development of student confidence and capacity.

Clubs run after school and at lunch each weekly to allow students to complete home learning and access additional support and resources in school.

Anthology works/interviews are on Satchel:One. Students are given analysis sheets to complete and help with revision.

NEA practical work: Students have begun all three pieces of NEA work. Students are expected to rehearse their choreography work in the studio, at least once per week.
