
CAREERS CAROUSEL

What is Unifrog?

Unifrog is a one-stop-shop where students can easily explore their interests, then find and successfully apply for their next best step after school.

Unifrog will help you to explore your key interests and what career paths you can take to reach your goals!



During the first week of December, Year 8's will log in to their Unifrog account for the first time during tutor. This software package will help support and guide their future pathway decisions through their remaining years at LVC.



What do we mean by Green jobs?

Direct green jobs are those roles that have a direct, positive impact on the planet. This includes jobs with environmentally conscious credentials, such as those in energy efficiency, renewable energy, electric vehicles, conservation, sustainability, waste reduction and adaptation to, or reduction in, climate change.

Indirect green jobs are jobs that contribute to the greening of economic activity but do not involve any new specific green skills or tasks. E.g. Hairdresser: consider the impact of the products they use on the environment, the energy they use, their water use, etc

All jobs are green jobs - Every job role, every organisation and business - we all have a role to play to ensure a sustainable future.

The challenges and impact of climate change are becoming ever more visible in our daily lives – flooding, droughts, wildfires, extremes of weather, impacts on health, agriculture and the environment.

In response, the transition to a low carbon economy has accelerated addressing these challenges. The Government's Net Zero Strategy (Build Back Greener) 2021 sets out the pathway to achieve Net Zero by 2050. The strategy sets out plans for reducing emissions from each sector of our economy, while hoovering up any remaining emissions with greenhouse gas removals – either natural, like trees, or technological, using carbon capture.

The number of low carbon businesses and their supply chains will grow, and the government has set an ambitious target for **two million green jobs in the UK by 2030**. The impact of the transition to net zero on the UK's labour market will be significant: with one estimate suggesting up to 20% of the workforce could see demand for their skills affected, either positively or negatively, along with new skills and knowledge required.




