## 2. Complete homework on Satchel:one

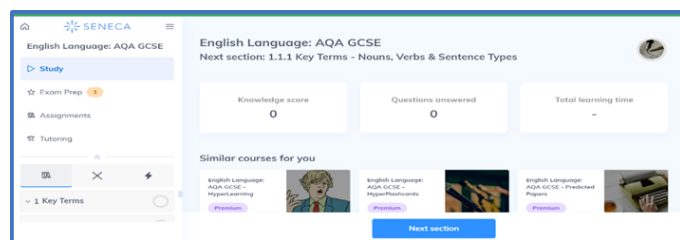
