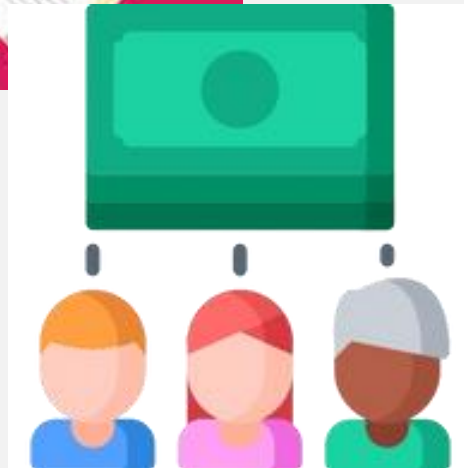
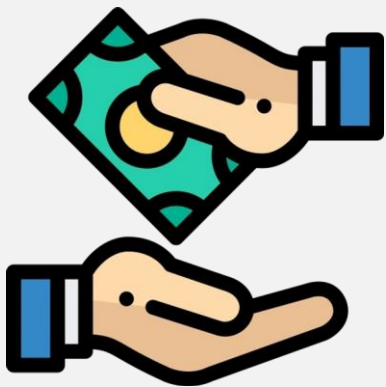

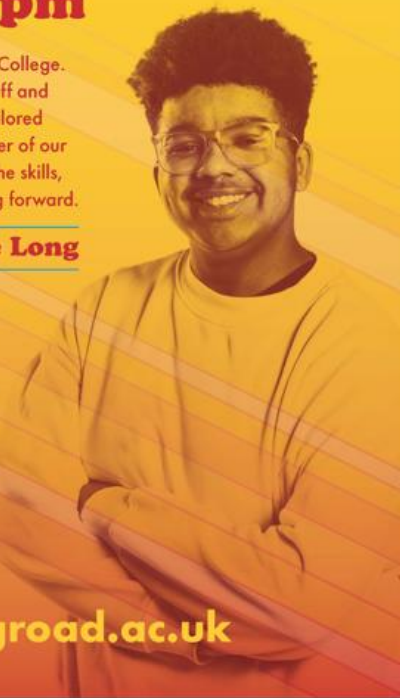

Enrolment

Students need to check their enrolment date and time on their Start of Year communication (email / letter) sent out in late July. Cambridge Academy for Science and Technology (CAST)

Students in receipt of offers from CAST will receive letters inviting them to timed enrolment meetings on Friday 22nd August, if the timing of this is not convenient they should contact the admissions team on admissions@CambridgeAST.org.uk to rearrange the appointment.

Any students who want to study A level or T level courses and meet the entry requirements, but have not previously had an offer from CAST, please also contact the admissions team on admissions@CambridgeAST.org.uk. Should spaces be available they will be invited to an appointment.

Hills Road Sixth Form College

On 11th August, offer holders will receive an email with guidance on our enrolment process. Until then, the essential information is:

- Enrolment will take place online on Thursday 21st August (GCSE Results Day).
- Requests to change A level courses are part of the enrolment process.
- There are two stages to enrolment:
- Stage One: Upload a document, scan or photograph of your GCSE exam results, and a photograph for your College card. You can take this before and save it for enrolment, if you'd like to.
- Stage Two: Once your GCSE results and photograph have been checked, you will receive an email explaining how to complete Stage Two, which secures your place at the College.
- If your GCSE results do not meet the entry requirements for any of your offered A level courses, please stay in the process and complete Stage 1 enrolment. We will contact you to arrange an appointment to discuss next steps at our Advice Hub on Tuesday 26th August, including possible alternative A level courses.

The Admissions office will be open for most of the summer holidays, and throughout August, so please do contact us with any questions or issues: admissions@hillsroad.ac.uk

Cambridge Maths School

In July, all students who have been made an offer will receive full instructions about the enrolment process via their Applica log in, including how to submit their exam results.

Please ensure you submit your results by 1pm on Thursday 21st August.

Following this we will be in touch with everyone who is holding an offer. There will be an opportunity for students who do not meet their offer to discuss their situation. You can either email admissions@cms.tela.org.uk or we will contact you directly on the afternoon of 21st August. If places become available for students on the waiting list, we will contact you on the afternoon of the 21st August.

College of West Anglia

All applicants will be expected to upload a photo of their grade sheet to our student portal. This will allow us to confirm that the applicant has met the entry requirements for their course and complete their enrolment.

There is no need to contact us separately – applicants just need to upload the grades and we'll take it from there.

If an applicant doesn't meet the entry requirements for the course, we will contact them to discuss their options. In most instances, we'll be able to offer an alternative level for their chosen course. We will send numerous reminders about this throughout the summer and will be pointing applicants to our website – cwa.ac.uk/starting-college.

Long Road Sixth Form College

All students who hold an offer with Long Road will be sent an overview of the enrolment process in July, including how and when to submit their exam results.

Exam results will need to be submitted via [Admissions+](#) by no later than 1pm on Friday 22nd August. Students can expect to receive offers from 22nd August, onwards. Students will be given the opportunity to request an enrolment meeting (conducted via telephone) to discuss their course options. Those who do not meet the entry requirements for their original choices, will automatically be invited to a telephone meeting to discuss alternative courses, wherever possible. Telephone meetings will be held on 27th and 28th August.

Once the enrolment offer has been accepted, students will receive IT onboarding instructions to be completed online, ahead of orientation.

- Virtual Student Enrolment: 27th- 28th August
- On-site Orientation Days: 3rd- 4th September

Oakes College

Students will be sent information regarding enrolment by the end of term and are encouraged to enrol in person. Any student unable to enrol on their designated date should contact the College Office in advance (01223 868327) and make an alternative appointment or make contact by emailing enrolment@oakescc.org. All offer holders will be invited to Oakes to enrol on Thursday 21st August in person and applicants are encouraged to secure their place on that date. If they are not able to enrol in person, they will be able to enrol online using the email enrolment@oakescc.org. Enrolment in person will also take place on Friday 22nd August and Wednesday 27th August.

If a student does not meet the admissions criteria, we would ask them to book an appointment by emailing enrolment@oakescc.org. The college office will be open following GCSE results day as follows:

Thursday 21st August (9:30 to 2:30pm) Friday 22nd August (9:30 to 2:30pm)
Wednesday 27th August (9:30 to 2:30pm)

Students are advised to telephone or email in advance to book an appointment enrolment@oakescc.org. Zoom calls can be arranged for those students who are not in the Cambridge area.

Term commences for year 12 on Wednesday 3rd September. We will be teaching our full curriculum in lessons on the college site.

Abbeygate Sixth Form College

Enrolment Day 21st August instructions:

Login to your online admissions portal account and complete the enrolment wizard. As part of this process, you will need to upload a picture of your GCSE results and an ID Photo. NOTE: We will send more detailed instructions on how to complete this process over the summer holidays.

Once you have completed the enrolment process, we will update your online admissions portal with details of your next step. We will send you details of your Induction session.

West Suffolk College

We will be sending out an enrolment guide to all applicants who have received an offer to the college in June/July, and this will provide them with further details including uploading their photo ID as soon as possible from July onwards and what they need to do to enrol. WSC enrolment will take place online from the 21st August.

Applicants will be required to submit their results via the link and complete some additional questions.

Once you have completed the enrolment process, we will update your online admissions portal with details of your next step. We will send you details of your induction session.

If you would like to speak to someone regarding course options there will be an 'Explore Your Options' event for those pupils who need additional support on Friday, 22nd August. No Booking Required.
