



Top Tips for Geography Revision

1. Make the most of your final Geography lessons

Teachers are geography specialists and have planned lessons, tasks and revision so you can get the most out of these. Make notes, ask questions, check if you are not sure about something.



2. Know your case studies

Use your notes, the online resources to make sure you know your case studies and Place specific examples. Naming places means marks! Try to include data and statistics which support your answers and back up key points.

3. Know key Geographical terminology well

You need to know what the key terms mean so you know what the question is asking you to do. Use revision resources, flashcards and highlighting your own books to know the definitions.

4. Know what the question is asking you to do

You need to know exam command words - explain, evaluate, assess, to what extent, describe, complete, suggest. Look at past papers and questions in lessons to help you get familiar with these so you know what you need to do.

5. Use the figures and resources in the exam

All geography papers are full of sources, figures and information. To get quick wins use this to your advantage. It is a skill to identify what the information in the paper shows.
